Travel to Gainesville FL:

Shuttles from the Gainesville (GNV) airport to the Holiday Inn:

The Holiday Inn will provide shuttle service from the Gainesville airport to the hotel. When you reach the Gainesville airport, if the shuttle is not already onsite, call the Holiday Inn at 352-376-1661 to request a shuttle pick-up. If the shuttle is unavailable, taxis are usually available at the airport and can be called to pick you up by pushing the red 'Taxi Button' outside the front entrance to the airport. Also, Bestway Cab is a local taxi service and may be reached at 352-367-8222. Taxi to/from the airport is \$20-25.

Hotel Check-in:

A block of rooms has been reserved for Symposium participants and speakers. Participants are responsible for reserving and paying for their lodging from this block of rooms. Rooms at the iDigBio group rate are only available until **April 22**. Funded speakers only need to check in as part of the iDigBio room block; their lodging will be paid by iDigBio via direct bill from the Holiday Inn.

Shuttles to Symposium Venue:

The distance between the Holiday Inn and Emerson Alumni Hall is 0.6 miles, which is within walking distance. If you choose not to walk, you can either (1) request the shuttle at the Holiday Inn front desk or (2) take the #5 westbound city bus that stops in front of the Holiday Inn and will drop you off approx. 1 block east of Emerson Hall at NW 19th St. For more information on how to use the Gainesville RTS, visit <u>http://go-rts.com/</u>. The fare is \$1.50 each way.

Reception:

There will be a reception on Monday, May 5, from 6:30-9:00pm at the Florida Museum of Natural History (FLMNH). Heavy hors d'oeuvres will be served, and there will be a cash bar. Museum exhibits will be open. Pre-arranged shuttle transportation will be available to transport attendees from the Holiday Inn to Powell Hall (FLMNH) at 6:15pm, with pickup at Powell Hall at 9:00pm for return to the Holiday Inn.

Meals and Other Related Activities:

Light breakfast along with coffee, juice, and tea will be available onsite at Emerson Alumni Hall beginning at 8 am on Monday and Tuesday. In addition, mid-morning and mid-afternoon break refreshments will be provided. Alternatively, a full breakfast menu is available each morning at Beef O'Bradys, located at the Holiday Inn. Field Trips:

Two field trips are being offered to Symposium attendees:

- 1. La Chua Trail at Paynes Prairie Preserve State Park, a large marsh and wetlands on the southern edge of Gainesville (<u>http://www.floridahikes.com/paynes-prairie-lachua</u>), is a popular birding site with an impressive population of alligators. The round-trip hike is about 3 miles on flat land, and you are guaranteed to see dozens of (small to very large) alligators and other wildlife. This trip is free of charge.
- 2. A canoe trip on the Ichetucknee River at Ichetucknee Springs State Park (<u>http://www.floridastateparks.org/ichetuckneesprings</u>). This is a spectacularly beautiful river about one hour from Gainesville. It takes ~2 hours to complete the trip – paddling downstream on a spring-fed, gently flowing river (very easy!). Total time to/from Gainesville will be 4-5 hours, and the cost is \$35/person including transportation, canoe (or kayak) and park entry.
