The Wiki is accessible now and will remain accessible in perpetuity. Please visit it at your convenience, but at least prior to the workshop. A copy of this e-mail is also stored there as Pre-Workshop Instructions under Workshop Logistics.

- 2) You are able to make additions to the Wiki by creating an account on iDigBio.org. You will find an account creation link on the right side of the Wiki page, under the heading Personal Tools. I encourage everyone to create an account. If you have difficulties with this process, feel free to contact Kevin Love (klove@flmnh.ufl.edu) or me for assistance.
- 3) Please carefully review the workshop logistics document (which includes reimbursement and travel information), also available through the Wiki.
- 4) You are strongly urged to bring a laptop with you to the workshop. Several sessions will include online components, for which a laptop will be essential. Valdosta State has created wireless access accounts for each of you to facilitate use of the Wiki and the online experiences.
